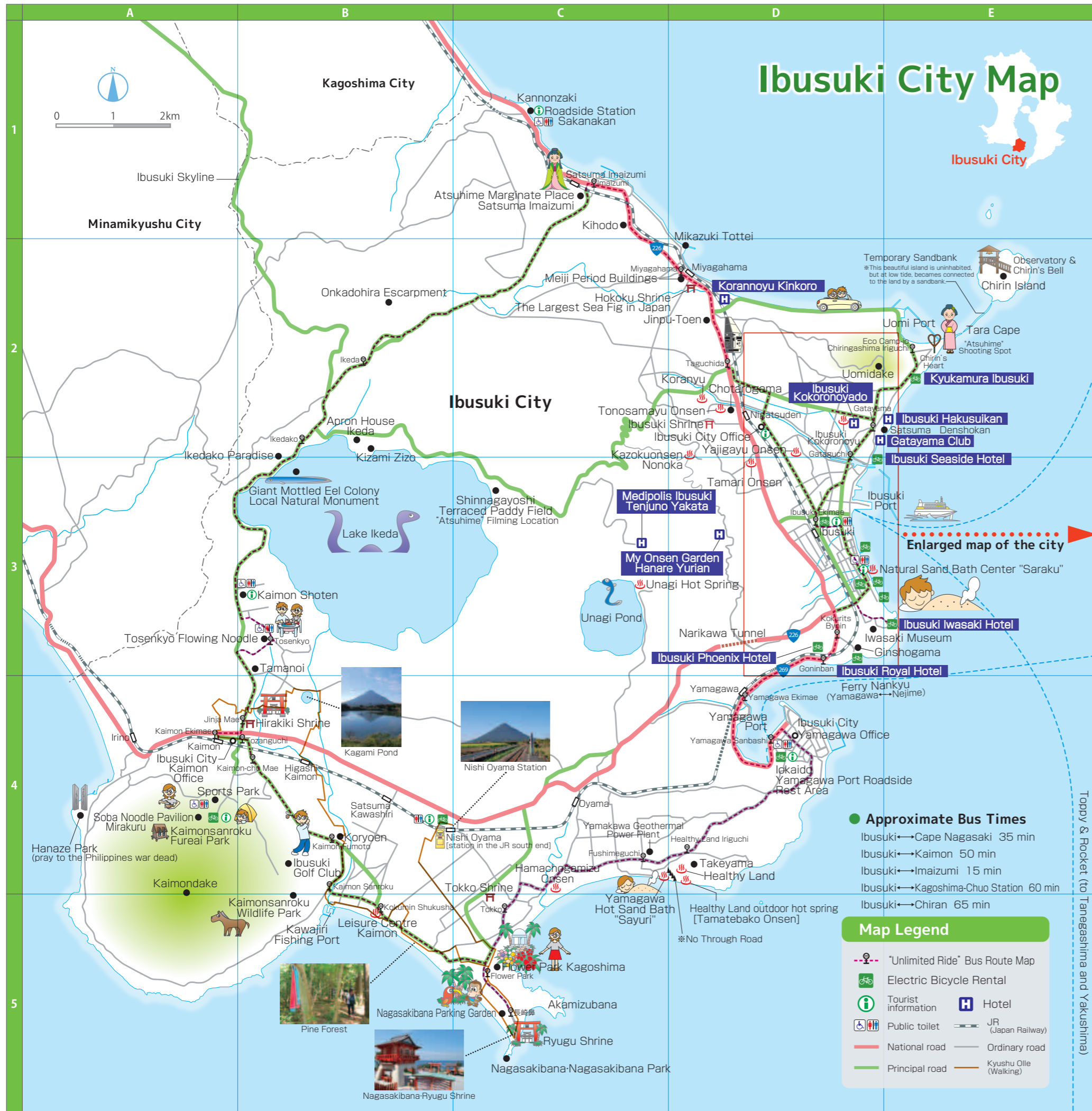


Ibusuki City Map

Ibusuki City Sightseeing Spots



Saraku Natural Sand Bath Center [D-3 / G-4]

This unique natural sand bath hot spring uses heat from hot springs that well on the coast. The heat of the hot spring and the weight of the sand will relax both your mind and body. The bath is also effective for dieting.

Mt. Kaimon (Kaimon-dake) [A-4]

This famous 924-meter-tall mountain has a gorgeous conical shape like that of Mount Fuji, which has earned it the nickname "Satsuma Fuji".

Mount Uomi and Chirin Island (Uomi-dake and Chiringashima) [E-2]

A beautiful deserted island floating in Kinko Bay. A sandbar connecting the island to the mainland appears when the spring tide is at low tide.

Rape Blossoms at Lake Ikeda (Ikeda-ko) [B-3]

The largest lake in Kyushu, Lake Ikeda is 15 km in circumference and 233 m deep. Giant mottled eels inhabit the lake, which has a mysterious atmosphere. Flowers of all colors bloom abundantly, including Lake Ikeda's characteristic rape blossoms, which appear from winter to spring.

Cape Nagasaki (Nagasaki-bana) [C-5]

This cape is the southernmost point on the Satsuma Peninsula. The cape offers a stunning view of Mt. Kaimon and is popular as a sunset-viewing spot.
